

Dear Squasher:

A glance back to last season provides an encouraging view. Our membership reached an all time high; the new tournament rules that were implemented proved functional; more persons participated in State tournaments than ever before; and all the tournaments were completed on time. A special "thank you" goes to Alex Sotir who had overall responsibility for the tournaments.

Some highlights of last year included an exhibition between Mo Khan and his brother, Gul. Mike Roizen was instrumental in arranging this match. Last March we saw a preview of the finals of the National Doubles as Diehl Mateer and his son, Gilbert, played Mo Heckscher and Mike Pierce in the finals of the Baltimore Invitational Doubles Tournament. The Mateers won in three games. Joe Lacy was responsible for lining up the top players for this event and we can thank him for the high caliber of competition.

We now have three national champions living in Baltimore. Mark Talbott won the Junior Boys' Nationals while Tom Schweizer and Gene O'Conor captured the National Senior Doubles crown. Our special congratulations go to these players.

In the ladies department Margaret Riehl (who is now president of the United States Women's Squash Racquets Association) and Helen Lacy coordinated the Baltimore Invitational Women's Singles tournament and produced a "dream" final. It matched the number one ranked woman player in the country — Ginny Akabane — against the number two ranked player — Goldie Edwards. Ginny won in five exciting games.

Let's turn to the present. For those members of the Association who have reached middle-aged status there will be an additional tournament this season. A rule change has specified that the Veteran and Senior Doubles be played at different times enabling those who qualify by age to participate in both.

During the weekend of February 21-22, your Association will host the Grant-Lapham Matches. This annual tournament combines 15 singles matches and seven doubles matches between the top players from Canada and the United States. Three weeks later the MSSRA will host the Baltimore Invitational Doubles tournament which is again being held one week prior to the National doubles and will undoubtedly attract the finest players in the country to our area,

There is one notable departure this year from the format of past years. The final round matches of the MSSRA Championships will be held Saturday, January 31, rather than on a Thursday evening as has been customary. The awards presentation ceremony will be held Saturday evening at the Mount Washington Club during the annual Association party.

I am looking forward to seeing you on the court, off the court but always in good health and good spirits.

New Blood for Young Swingers

Peter Parker, who has three youngsters of his own in the Junior Squash Program, is the new director of that activity for 1975-76. Tom Reilly is stepping down to "get some new blood in here," as he puts it. Tom was a founder of the program in 1971 and has been its chief mover ever since. Congratulations on doing an excellent job for a worthwhile cause.

An Idea Worth Considering

Reflecting on junior squash in Baltimore, Tom Reilly says, "we're hoping within a year or so to begin a Baltimore Invitational Junior Squash Tournament with players from all over participating." The idea is still just that — an idea. Hope it materializes though.

Directors have again been designated for each of the MSSRA's 1975-76 tournaments, according to John Beatson, tournament chairman. This system was initiated last season. Did it work? Every tournament ended on schedule. That's your answer.

The second vice president of the MSSRA shall serve as chairman of the Tournament Committee and shall appoint a director who shall be responsible for running the particular tournament he or she has been assigned in accordance with the published tournament schedule.

All matches — with no exceptions — shall be played by the time specified on the draw sheet.

Sign-up sheets shall be posted two weeks prior to the start of a tournament. Draw sheets shall be posted three days prior to the start of a tournament. Sign-up and draw sheets shall be posted at the Baltimore Country Club. The Johns Hopkins University, the Maryland Club, the Racquet Club and the Towson YMCA.

No person may enter a tournament unless he is a paid member of the Maryland State Squash Racquets Association.

All matches will be played in the greater Baltimore area unless otherwise mutually agreed upon.

The top man in each individual pairing is responsible for the time and place of the match and also for meeting the draw sheet deadlines.

Winners of each match must report scores to the tournament director immediately following each match.

The official ball to be used will be listed on the draw sheet, but another ball may be used if mutually agreed upon.

The tournament director will referee the final match but there will be no referees for other rounds unless specifically requested and agreed upon by the tournament director.

Attire shall be white.

Subject to the above local rules, all matches shall be played in accordance with the rules of squash as promulgated by the United States Squash Racquets Association and published in its last annual yearbook.

Defaults will be strictly enforced for the violation of any of the above rules. So observe the rules, play your matches on time — and, most of all, enjoy yourself.

Women's Squash

Women's squash in Maryland and the surrounding areas is growing more popular and more intense each year. Here's a brief review of what the gals did during the 1974-75 season and what's expected this year.

A Look Back . . .

- Five teams participated in inter-club singles with the Racquet Club #1 team capturing the title from the Baltimore Country Club's #1 team by one match.
- The top three women squash players in the country participated in the Baltimore Open held in December (Ginny Akabane, of Rochester, ranked 1; Goldie Edwards of Pittsburgh, number 2; and Barbara Maltby, of Philadelphia, number 3). The seeding proved accurate as Ginny edged Goldie in a five-game final.
- Two Baltimore teams of five players each visited New Haven for the inter-city Howe Cup matches in February. Our B team lost its division by one match while the C team lost by only two matches.
- Nancy Miller had a terrific year. She won the State singles, the State doubles with Mary Brooks and the Mixed Doubles with Dave Talbott. You can't get much better than that!
- With the help of Jim Hense, Nancy Miller also started a junior girl's squash clinic which ran for 12 weeks and attracted about a dozen girls. In the season-ending tournament Jesse Wittich captured the A Flight (plus the Girl's Achievement Award) while Ann Mitchell won the B Flight.
- Marge Riehl, Helen Lacy, Mary Brooks and Nancy Miller traveled out-of-state to several tournaments where they gained valuable experience playing top-flight competition.

A Look Ahead . . .

- Two additional teams are expected to join the inter-club league bringing the number of entries to seven. Hopefully the league will include some doubles play this season.
- Joyce Hogan has been instructing and coaching female students at the Johns Hopkins University who are interested in squash. Some women have been playing at a private court in Bel Air (a house addition no less) preparing for this season's play, and girls from Goucher College have also taken up the game.

- Margaret Riehl has stepped down as Maryland district president for women's squash — and for a good reason. She is the new president of the United States Women's Squash Racquets Association. If you know Marge, you know the USWSRA couldn't have made a better choice.
- Lynn Unger is the new Maryland district president and Helen Lacy is chairman of the USWSRA Ranking Committee while Mary Brooks is chairman of the inter-city Howe Cup matches this year, a task calling for scheduling 17 teams in three divisions.

Our thanks to the many men who have worked with us and assisted us by refereeing, judging and supporting our tournaments.

Junior Squash

Boy and Girl Programs Now Operating; Reilly Steps Down

As we begin a new season, the Association's Junior Squash Program can look back to a successful 1974-75 campaign. The accomplishments of the program last year included the formation of the first Girls' Squash Clinic and the performances of Mark Talbott, the United States National Boys Champion.

Tom Reilly, whose hard work and leadership led to creation of the Boys' Clinic in 1971, helped plan and organize the girls program. Nancy Miller did an outstanding job directing the Saturday morning sessions for the young ladies which were held at the Racquet Club.

A total of seven girls ranging in age from 12 to 17 showed up for the first clinic session last November. Using Hashim Khan's squash book as a guide and working under the expert instruction of Maryland Club pro, Eddie Sheaffer, the girls developed into capable players.

Jesse Wittich received the Achievement Award for her enthusiasm, cooperation and ability during the clinic. After spring vacation, the final tournament was conducted with Ann Mitchell defeating Mindy Harper in the B Flight and Jesse Wittich beating Jeanne Frank in the A Flight final which went five games.

MSSRA CONSTITUTION AND BY LAWS

ARTICLE I TITLE AND PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The Title of this Association shall be the "Maryland State Squash Racquets Association". The principal office of the Association shall be in Baltimore, Md.

ARTICLE II OBJECT

The purpose of this Association shall be to promote the game of squash racquets in the Maryland area, to protect the mutual interests of the members of the Association, and to establish and enforce uniformity in the rules of the game.

ARTICLE III UNINCORPORATED ASSOCIATION

The Association shall be an unincorporated Association in accordance with the laws of the State of Maryland. The Association is not organized and shall not be conducted for pecuniary profit and no part of its funds, however acquired, shall inure to the benefit of any officer, member or individual, except that the Association may pay consideration for work, labor or materials furnished to it.

In addition to the powers specifically conferred upon it by law, the Association shall have the power to receive gifts, devices and bequests of money or property of whatsoever kind or description; to acquire, hold, sell, give or otherwise dispose of such real and personal property as the purposes of the Association may require; and generally to do any and all other acts and things incident to and in furtherance of the aforesaid purposes of the Association not forbidden by law or by the by-laws of the Association.

ARTICLE IV MEMBERSHIP

- Section 1. Types of membership, Membership shall consist of MILITARY AND COLLEGIATE ORGANIZATIONAL and INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS.
- SECTION 2. MILITARY shall consist of those individuals who are members of the military service and who are stationed at a military establishment within the State of Maryland, or who are attending a military school within the State of Maryland. Annual dues will be established by the Executive Committee.

COLLEGIATE shall consist of those individuals who are bona fide students of any school, college or university within the State of Maryland. Annual dues will be established by the Executive Committee.

- SECTION 3. ORGANIAZATIONAL MEMBERS shall consist of those clubs and associations located in Maryland, and which have been duly elected to membership by the Executive Committee. Dues and fees for the member clubs shall be set by the Executive Committee.
- SECTION 4. INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS shall be players or friends of squash who are residents of the State of Maryland and who pay annual dues to the Association in an amount established by the Executive Committee at the annual meeting. They shall be members of an organizational club or should be invited to join by Executive Committee. Individual members shall be (1) Entitled to participate in tournaments sponsored by the Association and (2) to receive a copy of the Association yearbook without charge and (3) to vote at any general membership meeting.

ARTICLE V EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- Section 1. Powers The Executive Committee shall be entrusted with the management of the Association, it shall be its duty to carry out the purposes of the Association according to the by-laws, and shall be the final authority in all matters concerning policy, administration and management of the Association.
- Section 2. Corporation The Executive Committee shall consist of the following members:

A. One designated representative from each member organization.

B. The duly elected officers of the Association.
C. The representative or representatives to the USSRA appointed by the President to represent the Association.

D. The immediate two Past Presidents.

E. The chairmen of all committees designated in these by-laws.

F. Any additional member(s) as designated by the President.

A majority of the members of the Executive Committee shall consititute a quorum.

ARTICLE VI OFFICERS

- Section 1. OFFICERS The officers of this Association shall consist of a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and an Historian.
- Section 2. Election and Term of Office The officers shall be elected by a majority vote at the Annual Meeting of (The Organizational Clubs) the Association for a period of two years. In the event of absence or disability of any officer of the Association for a prolonged period of time, the Executive Committee may fift such vacancy during such absence, or for the remainder of his or her term of office.

ARTICLE VII DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- a. President and Vice-President: The President, and in his absence the First Vice-President, shall preside at all meetings of the Association and Executive Committee, and if neither shall be present, the Second Vice-President, the Secretary or Tresurer, respectively, shall preside. The President shall appoint all committees not otherwise herein provided for; appoint the representative or representatives to the National Association (U.S.S.R.A.); and oversee the performance of respective duties of other officers, committees and representatives. In the event of absence or disability of the President, the Vice-President shall possess and exercise all the powers of the President.
- b. Vice President and Second Vice President: In addition to the duties outlined in "a" above, the First Vice President shall serve as Chairman of the Ranking Committee, and Chairman of the Invitational Doubles Tournament, or be responsible for the appointment of the chairman, whose appointment must be approved by the Executive Committee.

The second Vice President shall serve as Chairman of the Tournament Committee.

- Secretary: The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence and keep the records of the Association and its Executive Committee, shall issue calls for such meetings and shall perform such other duties as the Executive Committee may from time to time require, He shall also serve as Chairman of the Inter-Club Squash League.
- d. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall collect the dues and other revenue of the Association, pay all authorized bills, keep the accounts of the organization, submit a report of the financial condition of the Association at the first annual meeting of the Executive Committee and a proposed budget for the ensuing year. He shall serve as chairman of the Scheduling Committee.

The Tressurer shall also purchase prizes for competitions sponsored by the Association and have them suitably engraved. He shall perform such other duties as the Executive Committee may from time to time require.

e. Historian: The Historian shall maintain records of winners and runners-up of all tournaments, shall maintain a file of all suitable photographs and clippings. He shall research all previous tournaments in order to maintain accurate historical records. He shall keep a record of the donors of all trophies. He shall research previous records in order to maintain a record of previous presidents of the Association. He shall be in charge of publicity and publications. He shall be responsible for the publication of the annual yearbook. He shall perform such other duties as the Executive Committee may from time to time require.

ARTICLE VIII MEMBERSHIP DUES

c.

- Organization: Each member organization shall pay the Treasurer each playing season annual dues for membership entitling them to participate in interclub play with one team, singles or doubles.
- b. Individual:
- Active any individual member who wishes to compete on a team for an organization or in tournament play, to be officially ranked and who wishes to participate in all other Association activities and benefits.
- Contributing Those members who wish to be entitled to all the benefits of the Association and as a friend of the Association and the game of squash racquets in the Maryland area contribute to and sponsor the Association's activities.
- The amount of the annual dues and additional fees shall be set by the Executive Committee at the first annual meeting and such dues and fees are payable upon receipt of the bill from the Treasurer.

ARTICLE IX MEETINGS

- The annual meeting of the Association shall be held on the last Wednesday in March of each year.
- Special meetings and meetings of the Executive Committee may be called by the President at any time upon seven days notice.

ARTICLE X COMMITTEES AND REPRESENTATIVES

 Ranking Committee: This committee shall consist of at least 3 members; the Chairman shall be the First President of the Association.

The ranking shall be furnished to the Secretary and Historian of the Association prior to 1st June of each year.

 Scheduling Committee: The committee shall consist of at least 2 members. The chairman shall be the Treasurer of the Association.

The Schedule, including the locations of each tournament, shall be furnished to the Secretary and Historian prior to 1st June of each year.

- c. Publicity Committee: This committee shall be chaired by the Historian of the Association and such other members as he may appoint and shall effectuate adequate publicity of all activities of the Association.
- d. Tournament Committee: This committee shall be chaired by the Second Vice President of the Association and such other members as he may appoint. It shall be the duty of the committee to make the draw and preparations for all tournaments of the Association. This committee shall have authority on matters concerning eligibility, defaults, scheduling of matches, time of play, and collection of entry fees as shall be determined by the Executive Committee.
- Referees Committee: This committee shall be appointed by the President of the Association. It shall be the duty of this committee to provide referees for all tournaments.
- f. Nominating Committee: This committee shall consist of three individual members of the Association, each of whom shall represent a different organization. The Chairman shall be the immediate past president of the organization. It shall be their duty to nominate officers for the coming season, The report of this committee shall be submitted in writing to the President and Secretary three weeks prior to the March meeting, at which time officers shall be elected.
- 9. Representative to the U.S.S.R.A.: The representative(s) to the U.S. Squash Racquets Association shall attend, on behalf of the Association, meetings of the U.S. Squash Recquets Association and shall represent the Association on all matters at such meetings. He shall be appointed at the annual meeting by the President with the approval of a majority of the Executive Committee.
- h. Special Events Committee: Shall consist of a Chairman and such other members as he may appoint. This committee shall organize, and supervise any and all "special" activities not connected with tournament or interclub play, i.e. visiting teams, exhibition matches, and any other activity which the Association may undertake.
- Committees:
- 1. Membership
- 2. Annual Dinner
- 3. Fitzgerald Cup
- 4. National Team
- 5. Ladies Committees

In addition to the foregoing standing committees, the President shall at any time appoint such other committees as may be necessary for the proper functioning of the Association.

ARTICLE XI AMENDMENTS TO CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

The Constitution and By-Laws may be amended at any meeting of the Executive Committee by the vote of two-thirds of all the members of the committee. Proposed amendments must be presented to the Secretary at least two weeks before any meeting and a copy of such amendments must be mailed by the Secretary to all members of the committee at least five days prior to said meeting.

 This Association shall abide by all rules of the United States Squash Racquets Association. Squash is fast, competitive and good for you.
