THE DEITZ SQUASH CLUB by Kay Deitz

The Deitz Club, located near Bel Air, Maryland, divides its year into three seasons. Each season ends with a tournament and a social event for its 60 year-round members. Last Fall's 70+ tournament, which ended in November, was won by Jim McCaslin with Mike Inlow as a finalist. The Saturday Night finals were followed immediately by a dance party held in the soft-pink-lit court. The hard ball tournament in March was narrowly won by Boo Smith, with Mike Inlow again the finalist. Mike was ahead 2-0 when Boo won the third game in a tense 5-point overtime. Boo won the next two games to take this exciting match. The English ball tournament, which ended the April-to-mid-July season, was won by Jeff Taylor with a score of 3-1 over Bob Gibbons. This tournament was celebrated with a swimming-bar-be-que party at the home of Don and Brenda McCaughey. Ninety persons, players and their families, swarn, ate and relaxed from one to nine pm on a hot July afternoon.

Our tournaments are open to men and women. All players are encouraged to enter. First-round losers enter a consolation flight. The Bata Shoe Company supported our Summer tournament by awarding their John Wooden and PolyMatch shoes to our three winners.

Most of our players were new to squash when we opened our court in January, 1975, but we now have about 15 players who are entering state competition this year. We have about 20 women and 40 men playing year-round. Our top men players are Bob Gibbons, Mike Inlow, Boo Smith and Jeff Taylor.

JOHNS HOPKINS UNIVERSITY by Bob Hogan

The actual game of squash doesn't change much at Hopkins. What does change is the pathology of the players. At one end of the ladder you have Bob Hogan perseverating over David Stam's consistent four wall boast ending in a nick and John Russell-Wood having a go at it before tea. The mid-ladder rivalries are as predictable as the rising sun. Steve Roth, in the most profound

statement of his squash career, concluded that he held the precise formula for losing to Mo Bessman. Larry Graves is successfully keeping acore with a pencil; now Jim Goodyear is confused. Louis (the hammer) Galambos has perfected the Hungarian reverse corner and is in the process of describing its theory and mechanics to Joyce Hogan and Bob Tucker. On his first attempt with the new stroke, Bob was heard saying in his prolific way, "Oh, Tuck, Tuck." At the other end of the ladder, the occupants are the women's undergraduate squash team. The top player in this group is Beth Yanowitz, who represented Baltimore women in a number of city events. 
THE MARYLAND CLUB by John Menton

Tournaments at the Maryland Club ran well into the late spring as 120 players engaged in regular play throughout the season.

In the A Singles, Bill Rice captured his third Club Championship in the last four years, but not before spotting Sandy Martin a two-game lead and numerous match points. The scores were 11-15, 12-15, 18-17, 17-14, and 17-14. In the semis, Bill defeated John MacColl, while Sandy was beating A.C. Hubbard by identical 3-0 scores.

The Club Championship Doubles saw the "Hall of Fame" team of Joe and Jim Lacy score a popular 3-1 upset win over the considerably younger Scott Ryan and Sandy Martin. In the semifinals, Joe and Jim took John MacColl and Frank Riggs 3-0, while Sandy and Scott were eliminating A. C. Hubbard and Bill Rice 3-0. This was, incidentally, Joe's eighth Club Championship in the last nine seasons.

In the B Singles, Jervy Finney solved the rather unusual game plan of fellow law man Peter Parker to score a 15-14, 14-15, 15-11, 15-14 win. Ron Creamer lost in the semis to Jervis 3-0, with Bud McNicholas bowing in the other half to Peter 3-0.

Jervis teamed with Bob Voelkel in the B-Doubles to score a 3-2 win over John Beatson and Tom Greene in a match that covered over two hours and featured "action" both on and off the court. In one of the top matches of this tournament Beatson-Greene beat Charlie Fenwick and Tim Schweizer 3-2 in the semis, while the veteran team of Sam Silber and Bruce Wilson lost 3-2 to the champs in the other half.

Bud Mc Nicholas scored a convincing 3-0 win over George Beall in the C Singles. Bud beat Dick Dunn 3-1 in the semis and George took Gary Wilson 3-1.

In the C Doubles, Tom Reilly and Bill Mitch defeated Gordon Priest and Rick Hook in a 3-0 match. Gordon and Rick had upset top seeds Lee Marston and McNicholas 3-1 in the semis, as Mary Trott-Peter Van Dyke lost to Tom and Bill in the other half.



Eddle Sheaffer did his usual outstanding job of arranging matches, teaching squash (and golf) and keeping everyone on his toes, while Charlie and George kept things rolling in the background. We all owe a vote of thanks to these three for their good spirits and hard work.

THE RACQUET CLUB by Margaret Riehl

The Racquet Club has continued in its unique way to serve the squash community of Baltimore. The Racquet Club members make available their time and the use of their courts to improve and encourage the growth of squash.

The State "A" Singles tournament was won by Dave Talbott this year. The Maryland State "B" Tournament title was captured by another Racquet Club member, Jim Hense. Nancy Miller was a finalist in the Maryland State Womens Championship and also was ranked tenth nationally, a first for a Marylander. Bob Hicks and Alex Sotir lost to Sandy Groff and John Minkowski, all Racquet Club members in the State "B" finals.

The Mens Interclub team did not fare too well this year. but look out teams, next year we will be strong.

Nancy Miller worked with the junior girls on Saturday mornings. We hope this program will continue. Thanks Nancy: we hope more people will be willing to give their time and talents to develop good young players.

Because of circumstances beyond our control, our leaders' efforts to have a more active 75-76 season were stifled. The only inclub tournament held was the Racquet Club Doubles Tournament won by Alex Sotir and John Riehl.

The season 1976-77 will provide a chance for all members to partake in various activities. The National Mixed Doubles and the Baltimore Open will be held at the Racquet Club and the Baltimore Country Club. We plan to hold several club tournaments also. Many of the State Tournament matches will be played here.

THE TOWSON Y by Jim Tillman

Tournament activity at the Y this past season slowed down to nothing, but the overall activity increased as more members picked up the game. The demand for court time has increased considerably and both courts are usually scheduled for a week in advance. This summer the courts were cleaned and painted and are now in excellent condition for the start of the 76/77 season.

WOMEN'S SQUASH by Joyce Hogan

The Maryland state women initiated the 1975-76 tournament season by hosting the annual Baltimore Open Tournament in which thirty out-of-town and local players participated. The field included six of the top ten nationally ranked players and some excellent quarter-final and semi-final matches resulted. In the final round match, Barbara Maltby required a mere twenty minutes to eliminate Ginny Akabane with scores of 15-3, 15-3, and 15-9.

The January season for women's squash in Maryland holds two major events. First, the Maryland state women's singles tournament conducted over a three week period resulted in semifinal play with Nancy Miller vs. Helen Lacy and Joyce Hogan vs. Nancy Taylor. In the final match, Joyce Hogan upset the title defender, Nancy Miller, in an exciting and well played match 15-4, 15-11, 9-15, and 15-12. The second event, held the last week in January, brought two five-player teams to New Haven, Conn. for participation in the annual Howe Cup Intercity Matches. Although Baltimore does not enter an "A" team, both the "B" and "C" teams represented the city well. The "C" team, whose members included Mary Brooks, Sita Culman, Carla Fox, Bunny Kelz, and Beth Yanowitz, were just edged by Boston on the final day of play for the cup. The "B" team consisting of Anne Monahan, Joyce Hogan, Nancy Miller, Helen Lacy, and Nancy Taylor impressively won nineteen out of twenty matches to capture the "B" cup.

The 1976 National Singles Championships, conducted by the USWSRA and sponsored by Bancroft, were held in Philadelphia immediately prior to the USSRA national tournaments. Joyce Hogan and Nancy Miller were selected to represent Maryland in the thirty-two person draw. The last Maryland representative to be invited to the national tournament was Mary Brooks. who participated several years ago. Nancy Miller's performance at the Nationals plus her outstanding tournament play this year has earned her the tenth-ranked national position in the women's Nancy's well deserved ranking makes her the standings. first active player from Maryland to be nationally ranked.

With the heavy competition out of the way, the first "Mixed-Up" doubles tournament was held. Headed up by Ouisie Weadock, the team of Has Franklin and Betty Karukas defeated Don Townsend and Nancy Miller in the finals. More impressively, however, a special "boobie" prize was awarded to Eric Schmidt who arranged for three different partners during the entire tournament. That does raise some speculation.

During the first part of April, a seven player team raveled to Arlington, Va. to play the Washingtonians in what is hoped to be an annual event similar to the Fitzgerald Cup; Baltimore won the tournament 5-4, by clinching the final match of the day. Winners for Baltimore were Dinny Bradley, Helen Lacy, Brenda McCaughey, Ouis'e Weadock, and Beth Yanowitz.


Women's squash in Maryland is not confined to the Baltimore area --- ask anyone in Bel Air. The Deitz Squash Club is used regularly by approximately twenty-five women players. This club highlights a number of tournaments and competitive ladders for either men and women or both. At this point (Bel Air knows no squash season), the top players at the Deitz's court are Nancy Taylor, Kay Deitz, Barbara Pekala, Sandy Nolan, and Betty Karakus.

The ladies interclub competition was restructured this year to include six teams of four players each. The restructure was an attempt to provide adequate competition at each level on every team. While this was accomplished, the traditional club rivalry was sacrificed. A reevaluation is needed in attempting to resolve this dilemma.

Special thanks and recognition are in order for Marge Riehl, who has undertaken the overwhelming task of President of the USWSRA for two years; to Helen Lacy, who is the chairperson of the national ranking committee; to Mary Brooks, who has so ably and successfully served as chairperson of the Howe Cup Intercity Matches for the past two years; and to Nancy Miller, who patiently instructed the junior girls program for the last two years.

THE LAPHAM-GRANT MATCHES by Tom Schweizer

The Lapham Cup-Grant Trophy international squash matches between the United States and Canada were held in Baltimore last February for the first time since 1936. This annual combination singles and doubles competition dates back to 1922. and traditionally is played at alternating sites between the two countries. Old Timers Bill Lamble and Tommy Schweizer were co-chairmen for the event and along with their committee were responsible for a weekend of good times and warm friendship with our friends from Canada and United States players from all over the country. Other local competitors were Sandy Martin, Dave Talbott, Jim Lacy, Frank Riggs, Sam Silber, Al Weaver, Jimmy Hense, and Haswell Franklin. The U.S. won the singles 11-4, and Canada won the doubles 4-3. How friendly can you be?!!!

MSSRA

CONSTITUTION AND BY LAWS

ARTICLE 1 TITLE AND PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The Title of this Association shall be the "Maryland State Squash Racquets Association", The principal office of the Association shall be in Baltimore, Md.

ARTICLE II OBJECT

The purpose of this Association shall be to promote the game of squash racquets in the Maryland area, to protect the mutual interests of the members of the Association, and to establish and enforce uniformity in the rules of the game.

ARTICLE III UNINCORPORATED ASSOCIATION

The Association shall be an unincorporated Association in accordance with the laws of the State of Maryland. The Association is not organized and shall not be conducted for pecuniary profit and no part of its funds, however acquired, shall inure to the benefit of any officer, member or individual, except that the Association may pay consideration for work, labor or materials furnished to it.

In addition to the powers specifically conferred upon it by law, the Assocation shall have the power to receive gifts, devices and bequests of money or property of whatsoever kind or description; to acquire, hold, sell, give or otherwise dispose of such real and personal property as the purposes of the Association may require; and generally to do any and all other acts and things incident to and in furtherance of the aforesaid purposes of the Association not forbidden by law or by the by-laws of the Association.

ARTICLE IV MEMBERSHIP

- Section 1. Types of membership. Membership shall consist of MILITARY AND COLLEGIATE ORGANIZATIONAL and INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS.
- SECTION 2. MILITARY shall consist of those individuals who are members of the military service and who are stationed at a military establishment within the State of Maryland, or who are attending a military school within the State of Maryland. Annual dues will be established by the Executive Committee.

COLLEGIATE shall consist of those individuals who are bona fide students of any school, college or university within the State of Maryland. Annual dues will be established by the Executive Committee.

- SECTION 3. ORGANIZATIONAL MEMBERS shall consist of those clubs and associations located in Maryland, and which have been duly elected to membership by the Executive Committee. Dues and fees for the member clubs shall be set by the Executive Committee.
- SECTION 4. INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS shall be players or friends of squash who are residents of the State of Maryland and who pay annual dues to the Association in an amount established by the Executive Committee at the annual meeting. They shall be members of an organizational dub or should be invited to join by Executive Committee. Individual members shall be (1) Entitled to participate in tournaments sponsored by the Association and (2) to receive a copy of the Association yearbook without charge and (3) to vote at any general membership meeting.

ARTICLE V EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1. Powers - The Executive Committee shall be entrusted with the management of the Association, it shall be its duty to carry out the purposes of the Association according to the by-laws, and shall be the final authority in all matters concerning policy, administration and management of the Association.

Section 2. Corporation - The Executive Committee shall consist of the following members:

> A. One designated representative from each member organization.

> B. The duly elected officers of the Association. C, The representative or representatives to the USSRA appointed by the President to represent the Association.

- D. The immediate two Past Presidents.
- E. The chairmen of all committees designated in these by-laws.
- F. Any additional member(s) as designated by the President.

A majority of the members of the Executive Committee shall consititute a quorum.

ARTICLE VI OFFICERS

Section 1. OF a F

 OFFICERS - The officers of this Association shall consist of a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and an Historian.

Section 2. Election and Term of Office - The officers shall be elected by a majority vote at the Annual Meeting of (The Organizational Clubs) the Association for a period of two years. In the event of absence or disability of any officer of the Association for a prolonged period of time, the Executive Committee may fill such vacancy during such absence, or for the remainder of his or her term of office.

ARTICLE VII DUTIES OF OFFICERS

President and Vice-President: The President, and in his absence the First Vice-President, shall preside at all meetings of the Association and Executive Committee, and if neither shall be present, the Second Vice-President, the Secretary or Tresurer, respectively, shall preside. The President shall appoint all committees not otherwise herein provided for; appoint the representative or representatives to the National Association (U.S.S.R.A.); and oversee the performance of respective duties of other officers, committees and representatives. In the event of absence or disability of the President, the Vice President shall possess and exercise all the powers of the President.

Vice President and Second Vice President: in addition to the duties outlined in "a" above, the First Vice President shall serve as Chairman of the Ranking Committee, and Chairman of the invitational Doubles Tournament, or be responsible for the appointment of the chairman, whose appointment must be approved by the Executive Committee.

The second Vice President shall serve as Chairman of the Tournament Committee, Secretary: The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence and keep the records of the Association and its Executive Committee, shall issue calls for such meetings and shall perform such other duties as the Executive Committee may from time to time require. He shall also serve as Chairman of the Inter-Club Squash Leegue.

Treasurer: The Treasurer shall collect the dues and other revenue of the Association, pay all authorized bills, keep the accounts of the organization, submit a report of the financial condition of the Association at the first annual meeting of the Executive Committee and a proposed budget for the ensuing year. He shall serve as chairman of the Scheduling Committee.

The Tressurer shall also purchase prizes for competitions sponsored by the Association and have them suitably engraved. He shall perform such other duties as the Executive Committee may from time to time require.

Historian: The Historian shall maintain records of winners and runners-up of all tournaments, shall maintain a file of all suitable photographs and clippings. He shall research all previous tournaments in order to maintain accurate historical records. He shall keep a record of the donors of all trophles. He shall research previous records in order to maintain a record of previous presidents of the Association. He shall be in charge of publicity and publications. He shall be responsible for the publication of the annual yearbook. He shall perform such other duties as the Executive Committee may from time to time require.

ARTICLE VIII MEMBERSHIP DUES

Organization: Each member organization shall pay the Treasurer each playing season annual dues for membership entitling them to participate in interclub play with one team, singles or doubles. Individual:

 Active - any individual member who wishes to compete on a team for an organization or in tournament play, to be officially ranked and who wishes to participate in all other Association activities and benefits.

 Contributing - Those members who wish to be entitled to all the benefits of the Association and as a friend of the Association and the game of squash racquets in the Maryland area contribute to and sponior the Association's activities.

The amount of the annual dues and additional fees shall be set by the Executive Committee at the first annual meeting and such dues and fees are payable upon receipt of the bill from the Treasurer.

ARTICLE IX MEETINGS

Ranking Committee: This committee shall consist of at least 3 members; the Chairman shall be the First President of the Association.

> The ranking shall be furnished to the Secretary and Historian of the Association prior to 1st June of each year.

Scheduling Committee: The committee shall consist of at least 2 members. The chairman shall be the Treasurer of the Association.

> The Schedule, including the locations of each tournament, shall be furnished to the Secretary and Historian prior to 1st June of each year.

- Publicity Committee: This committee shall be chaired by the Historian of the Association and such other members as he may appoint and shall effectuate adequate publicity of all activities of the Association.
- Tournament Committee: This committee shall be chaired by the Second Vice President of the Association and such other members as he may appoint. It shall be the duty of the committee to make the draw and preparations for all tournaments of the Association. This committee shall have authority on matters concerning eligibility, defaults, scheduling of matches, time of play, and collection of entry fees as shall be determined by the Executive Committee.

Referees Committee: This committee shall be appointed by the President of the Association. It shall be the duty of this committee to provide referees for all tournaments.

Nominating Committee: This committee shall consist of three individual members of the Association, each of whom shall represent a different organization. The Chairman shall be the immediate past president of the organization. It shall be their duty to nominate officers for the coming season. The report of this committee shall be submitted in writing to the President and Secretary three weeks prior to the March meeting, at which time officers shall be elected.

- Representative to the U.S.S.R.A.: The representative(s) to the U.S. Squash Racquets Association shall attend, on behalf of the Association, meetings of the U.S. Squash Racquets Association and shall represent the Association on all matters at such meetings. He shall be appointed at the annual meeting by the President with the approval of a majority of the Executive Committee.
- Special Events Committee: Shall consist of a Chairman and such other members as he may appoint. This committee shall organize, and supervise any and all "special" activities not connected with tournament or Interclub 'play, i.e. visiting teams, exhibition matches, and any other activity which the Association may undertake.

Other Committees:

- 1. Membership 2. Annual Dinner
- 3. Fitzgerald Cup
- 4. National Team
- 5. Ladies Committees

In addition to the foregoing standing committees, the President shall at any time appoint such other committees as may be necessary for the proper functioning of the Association.

ARTICLE XI AMENDMENTS TO CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

The Constitution and By-Laws may be amended at any meeting of the Executive Committee by the vote of two-thirds of all the members of the committee. Proposed amendments must be presented to the Secretary at least two weeks before any meeting and a copy of such amendments must be mailed by the Secretary to all members of the committee at least five days prior to said meeting.

TOURNAMENT RULES

Directors have again been designated for each of the MSSRA's 1976-77 tournaments. According to the MSSRA Constitution, the Jecond vice president of the MSSRA this year, James Goodyear, shall serve as chairman of the Tournament Committee and shall appoint a director who shall be responsible for running the particular tournament he or she has been assigned in accordance with the published tournament schedule.

All matches - with no exceptions - shall be played by the time specified on the draw sheet.

Sign-up sheets shall be posted two weeks prior to the start of a tournament. Draw sheets shall be posted three days prior to the start of a tournament. Sign-up and draw sheets shall be posted at the Baltimore Country Club, the Deitz Squash Club, the Johns Hopkins University, the Maryland Club, the Racquet Club and the Towson YMCA.

No person may enter a tournament unless he is a paid member of the Maryland State Squash Racquets Association.

All matches will be played in the greater Baltimore area unless otherwise mutually agreed upon.

The top man in each individual pairing is responsible for the time and place of the match and also for meeting the draw sheet deadlines.

Winners of each match must report scores to the tournament director immediately following each match.

The official ball to be used will be listed on the draw sheet, but another ball may be used if mutually agreed upon.

The tournament director will provide a referee for the finalround play. He will also provide a referee for any preceeding rounds at the request of either player.

Attire shall be white or pastel.

Subject to the above local rules, all matches shall be played in accordance with the rules of squash as promulgated by the United States Squash Racquets Association and published in its latest annual yearbook.

Defaults will be strictly enforced for the violation of any of the above rules. So observe the rules, play your matches on time - and, most of all, enjoy yourself.
