

BOB BATES PRESIDENT, M.S.S.R.A. This spring marked the end of a rather radical year for Maryland squash. The 78-79 season saw a dramatic increase in the number of activities available for Maryland squash players from essentially one tournament for each competitive level, singles and doubles, to five or six tournaments for the singles player and two for the doubles enthusiast. The Baltimore Women's Open and the Baltimore Invitation Tournaments remained as show cases for great squash. Accompanying the increase to numbers of tournaments have been the number of squash participants and hours of tournament play. Those of us on the Maryland State Squash Racquets Executive Committee responsible for our programs think that this increased activity is good for us, good for the game and great fun for the players.

It has been noted frequently in our periodic news letters and we mention here again that without the participation and support of our local clubs in making available court time for these tournaments, there would be no program. Each of you who enjoys the benefits of organized squash should be aware of this and make your support known to the representative at your club who periodically makes your courts available for state activities.

This coming year will in large part be a repeat of the events scheduled last year. There is no increase in tournament activity. With an event scheduled approximately every month during the winter season together with a summer season of English squash, we feel that we have achieved a reasonable base level of activity. In this new season, we hope to improve on the quality of our events. You will find the 79-80 schedule of events elsewhere in these pages. One change you will note is the establishment of a racquet fee for all non-state championship tournaments. The establishment of this fee In lieu of a dues increase was deemed an equitable solution to balance the treasurer at the expense of those benefiting most from the increase in playing activity. The Executive Committee has also established as a policy that all flights of state activity are open to men and women alike and that all tournaments, save the Maryland State Championships, are open to professionals and our squashplaying friends outside our state borders.

As you peruse the pages of this yearbook, we hope it will assist you in planning a full season of squash activity and enjoyment. If you have suggestions for ways of improving our programs, policies, or scheduling, don't hesitate to contact me. In addition, if you would like to assist us in implementing our programs, we would love to hear from you.

Here's to a full and active squash season.



#### BALTIMORE COUNTRY CLUB by Joseph (Sammy) Fitzpatrick

The winner boards at the Baltimore Country Club will see a lot of new names this coming winter, because of the best squash year in recent history. There were many more younger faces and more interest in the game this past year then ever before.

The traditional member-guest tournament had the largest draw in recent memory, due to the younger members getting involved in the doubles game. Since we instituted three flights to give the novice doubles players to compete, we had 42 teams within the three flights.

The winners in the "B" flight were Gordon Gilbert and Dave Williams who defeated Jim Stieff and Dave Vanwagonburg 3-0.

In the "A" flight David Warfield and Rich Thomas defeated Bernie McCrory and John Riehl 3-1.

The championship flight was won by Joe Fitzpatrick and Jimmy Lacy III. (who filled in back-attack victim Jim Hense) and defeated the veteran team of Jack Bandiere and Bob Hogan 3-0.

A note must be made here that in the championship consolations, two old quarterbacks, hung in for an hour to win. Bob Williams, affectionary known as number 9 out of Notre Dame and Chicago and Tom Greene out of Holy Cross beat John Voneiff and Tom Reilly 3-2.

#### DEITZ SQUASH CLUB by Kay Deitz

This season celebrates our almost five years operating our single court in Bel Air. We average 50 players year round—40% women—and currently 17 are MSSRA members. Most state tournaments this past year had one of our players in final rounds of the B, C and D flights.

Our club's Fall Blue Dot tournament saw Bob Everd win 3/0 over Linda Denton. Our Winter 70 + tournament in March (with B ladder ineligible to play) had exciting final rounds with Bill Bruchey defeating Linda Denton 15-9 in the fifth game. Linda fed into the lower flight and defeated Bob Harner 3-0 which put her back against Bruchey in the finals. She defeated him 3-1. Since both players had now lost once, a finals replay was scheduled. The long awaited finals— Bruchey had sustained and recovered from an injury in the meantime— saw Ms. Denton take Bill apart for the second time 3-1 to confirm her win. An upset in the tournament was D player Tom Dietrich's win over C player Darryl Palmer. Of the upset Palmer said, "He could do no wrong."

Our Spring Club tournament (B ladder eligible) saw Bob Everd win over Bob Harner 3-1, Everd not losing a game through out the competition. Sandy Nolan defeated Chris Adam 3-2 in the consolation. Chris Adam, a C player in Toronto who recently moved to Belcamp, was down two games which at the beginning of the third game he asked, "How many games do I have to win?" Kay Deitz, scorekeeper, answered, "If you're going to win, you'd better start now." Adam went on to win the third and fourth games but Ms. Nolan managed to take the fifth and the consolation flight. "The first time I've ever won a prize in squash, except for winning a squash ball," said Sandy. Her time is definitely here.

Our Insilco competition with 16 club entrants saw Mike Inlow handily defeat Bob Everd in 3 games. Mike went on to Washington D.C.

In State competition Mike Inlow was a three-time finalist in C competition: in the Md. State C championship, the Fall 70 + tournament, and in the Baltimore City singles tournament. Kay Deitz was finalist in the women's division of the 70 + tournament and the Baltimore City singles. Boo Smith was semi-finalist in the State C's.

The 1979 Summer Ball tournament, with finals held at our club, saw three of our players in the A/B class, Paul Deitz, Smith and Inlow. Smith reached the semis of the consolation flight. Congratulations to Bob Everd for this year's outstanding success in squash. After winning the Maryland State D class, Everd went on to the C/D finals of the English tournament defeating Bob Travers 9-6 in the fifth game of the grueling 75 minute match, but losing in the finals to top seed Ron Attanasiou.

Paul Deitz was a semi-finalist in the Fall 70+ tournament and semi-finalist in the State B singles. With Jim Tillman he was finalist in the State B Doubles tournament.

Our club's WE TRY HARDER award unanimously goes to Anne Frezell who keeps us all on our toes with her friendly drawl, "I'd like to challenge you to a game. What time is most convenient for you?" Keep it up, Anne!" Thanks this year to Priscilla Corbett for getting our women together with her elegant holiday luncheon in January.

#### JOHNS HOPKINS WOMEN'S VARSITY SQUASH TEAM by Toby Gordon

Not to be outdone by the spectacular Hopkins men's lacrosse team, the Lady Jays stroked their way to a 7-1 season record, earning 8th place national ranking overall. Seniors Beth Yanowitz, Kate Foster, Barb Chang and Captain Nancy Tang (Captain Tang-aroo) formed the nucleus of the varsity team with tight racquet work and swift footwork. They amazed and demolished opponents, scarely losing a game in intercollegiate dual matches. The seniors were backed up by amazing performances from freshman Nunzie Gould, sophomore Lizz Cianos and Junior Lisa Gottesfeld. The team overwhelmed their opponents, not just by their playing ability, but by their size. At the Howe Cup tournament at Yale, Hopkins achieved notoriety for being the shortest and thus the best team per inch; there was a movement underfoot to change their team name from Johns Hopkins to Johns Munchkins. The University of Pennsylvania proved to be the nemesis of the Munchkins and two class losses, Howe Cup by one point and 5-2 intercollegiately, were recorded. coach Toby Gordon, Penn alumna and graduate student at Hopkins School of Public Health was anxious to beat Penn, but this feat was accomplished by outranking the Quakers rather then in head on

In the semis Sandy and Joe beat John Menton and Jim Lacy III, while A.C. and John handled Jim Lacy, Jr. and Tommy Schweizer.

Sandy Martin also took the A-Singles title over A.C. Hubbard 3-0, as well as the Handicap tournament played in early fall of '78 over Bill Rice 3-1.

In the B's, the Singles Title went to fast improving Dan Dent 3-1 over John Menton, and in the closest tournament match of the year the Doubles Championship was won by Jack Fetting and Tim Schweizer in a 3-2 naild-bite over Gordon Jones and Dick Britt. It was a unanimous decision that "Diamond" Fetting take a few days off after several tough matches on the way to the championship, including a 3-2 over Bill Mitch and Tom Reilly in the semis. Jones and Britt defeated John Beatson and Bill Tanton 3-0 in the other half.

C-Singles went to Jay Wilson by a 3-1 count over Lee Marston, who had edged Bill Mitch 3-2 in the semi-final while Jay eliminated John Morton in the other half. Lee Marston however did share the C-Doubles title with Bob Kent defeating Gordon Priest and Bill Tanton 3-1 in the finals.

The ever popular and highly coveted D-Singles title this year went to Peter Gerard by a narrow 3-2 over Bill Rienhoff. He also had a 3-2 win over Lou Manzo in the semis, while Bill defeated Ned Dukehart 3-1.

#### THE RACQUET CLUB by Jim McCaslin

The Racquet Club distinguished itself again this year with many its members gaining national as well as local acclaim. We consider the level of squash played at the Racquet Club to be high caliber, and are especially proud of our players who have earned national ranking. Nancy Taylor is ranked 3rd in the Women's "B", Denise Galambos is ranked 5th in junior girls; Peter Wolff ranked 11th in veterans (40+); and Joyce Hogan ranked 14th in the Women's Division. Murray Gillman won the "C" Consolation in the national Insilco B/C Championship and Joyce and Bob Hogan, although not given national ranking, won the respect of the national doubles circuit by distinguishing themselves in the national mixed doubles tournament.

The Racquet Club also sponsored three club tournaments this year. The Insilco "C" Tournament was won by Murray Gilman who went on to win the regional "C" championship. The Club Doubles Tournament featured three separate events — Sadie Hawkins Mixed Doubles, B Doubles, and A Doubles. Margaret Riehl and Jim Tillman defeated Carlisie Voekel and John Riehl to win the Mixed Doubles event (3-0). Linda Denton and Mary McGuirk overcame a late charge by Denise Galambos and Toby Gordon to win the B Doubles event (3-1). In the A Doubles event John Riehl and Alex Sotir outsteadied the perennial runners-up Jim Tilman and Peter Wolff to win 3-0. A handicap tournament was also sponsored this year for the very first time with John Minkowski defeating Murray Gilman in the finals (3-0).

On the local scene the Racquet Club numerically dominated MSSRA tournaments, Of the 295 players participating in our tournaments, the Racquet Club accounted for 104 for a 35% rate of participation. Mike Dunn won the English Ball B/C Flight, Bob Hogan

In the MSSRA State Championships, the Racquet Club placed five finalists in the singles competition; Don Townsend in the D Flight and Bob Hogan and Jim McCaslin in the "B" Flight; and Joyce Hogan and Mary McGuirk in the Women's Flight. In the doubles competition we placed 1.5 teams in the finals — John Riehl and Alex Sotir and Jim Tillman and Paul Deitz (obviously from the Deitz Squash Club) in the B Flight.

In regional play the Racquet Club again fielded an A and B team in the Naval Academy Invitational. In the Virginia State Open Joyce Hogan was very busy winning the Women's Open over another Racquet clubber Nancy Taylor and teamed with Bob Hogan to win the mixed doubles event. In the Insilco B/C Regional Tournament, Murray Gillman won the "C" division and Ray Blank lost in the semifinals in the "B" division. John Minkowski, Paul Ellis, Jim McCaslin and Bob Hogan of Racquet Club teamed up with Ted Berger of Annapolis and Bob Hicks of the Baltimore Country Club to form the Baltimore entry in the annual Boar's Head Tournament, Charlottesville, Virginia. The Baltimore team won the tournament handily and looks forward to defending its title this year.

The Racquet Club women are determined to put Maryland on the squash map despite the mediocre play of the men. In the Philadelphia Slazenger Open, Linda Denton won the Women's "C" Flight over Denise Galambos and Nancy Taylor reached the semi-finals in the Women's "B". In the Manheim Challenge Nancy Taylor was a winner with Linda Denton reaching the semi-finals. In the Howe Cup Competition, four Racquet Club women (Linda Denton, Mary McGuirk, Margaret Riehl, Nancy Taylor) teamed with Helen Lacy to place second in the "B" division while three of our ladies (Denise Galambos, Toby Gordon, and Lori Steiff) teamed with Candy Neville and Susan Reed to place second in the "C" division. Rumor has it that our women have made Gene O'Conor an honorary member of the Racquet Club Ladies Players Association!

Who would have believed that disco mania would strike the squash community! Yes, the Racquet Club has been painted in a smashing array of psychedelic colors and the lights flash on and off during play.

Last year it was reported that "75% of the lights were operational in the singles courts while 96% of the lights on the doubles court

For many years the finest caliber of Squash presented in Baltimore has annually been the Baltimore Invitational Doubles Tournament usually held in March. This year for the first time the program moved to January and s Singles draw was included.

The results were an artistic success. The Singles draw which featured some real "ironman" acts as players doubled up to play in both the Singles and Doubles draw saw the 6th Panked U.S. player Tom Poor of Boston beat his fellow New Englander Ron Beck (ranked #8) in 4 superbly played games.

After the traditional Sunday brunch break the Doubles final featured the 1976 National Champions from Philadelphia. Mike Pierce and Mo Heckscher, who are now both playing professionally, at the top of their games winning in 3 over local favorite Sandy Martin and Tom Poor, who are currently ranked #3 nationally.

Saturday nights disco party featured some memorable performances by the locals as well as the visitors, but a sensational "gator" exhibition by Peggy Senft was national caliber for sure. With a return next year to the traditional March date, we can only hope for the same high caliber of play, a repeat of this year's social aspects and a much needed increase in financial support to this fine event.

Upon losing National Junior Champ, Mark Talbott to brother David in Detroit we gained Hopkins student Arshad Malik from Palsistan, who was a finalist in the Virginia and Nercensburg Acadamey Junior Tourneys, winner of the National Capitol and excellent performer in the National Junior Tournament at Providence (won by Talbott). Denise Galaubos achieved a #5 ranking in the U.S. by her outstanding plan in several tournaments including a quarter final match in the National Juniors with #2 ranked finalist Nince Porter of Wilmington.

Maryland's sons played squash throughout the U.S. and Canada needing only a representative at the Mexican Singles to complete a sweep of North America (In participation, that is!) With the likes of Minkowski, Ellis, Rice, Hense, Hogan, Martin, Hicks, Menton, Jensen, Gilman, Taylor, O'Conor, Attanasio, Steinmann, and Wolff traveling variously from coast to coast, the search for triumph led to such tournaments as the Slagenger Summper Open (Phila. - Sept.); National Singles (Portland - Feb.); National Doubles (N.Y. - Mar.); INSILCO Nationals B/C (N.Y. - Mar.); Boodles Open (N.Y. - Apr.). The glorious victories (and a few close losses) are too numerous to review, but a few of the accomplishments are:

SANDY MARTIN— after second place finish in the Canadian Championship, earned #3 ranking in U.S. with partner Tom Poor of Boston by reaching semi-finals of the National Doubles.

BOB HICKS— and partner Art Sicular of N.Y.C. were bypassed at nationals in a narrow victory by last year's National Senior Doubles Champs, Graves and Dann of Bullalo. Bob also led a team to victory in the annual singles/doubles event at Boar's Head, Charlottesville, Va.

MURRAY GILMAN— won his club tournament and the regional qualifier in D.C., then lost to the ultimate champion in N.Y.C., but was winner of the National INSILCO "C" Consolation.

MALCOLM JENSEN— needed 50 points to win three straight second round games in the national Singles 40+ event, then in the quarterfinal met #2 Nationally Ranked Bob Benvin of N.Y.C. who won in four. This and other sanctioned play earned Malcolm a #10 ranking in 40 Vets. PETER WOLFF— in his first round match at the Portland tourney lost in four to defending U.S. champ, George Morfitt of Vancouver, B.C. Having lost in four to Canadian champion, Gerry Shugar at Rochester in January, Peter needed only to have played Mexican champ, Raul Sanchez to complete the tour, but was in the opposite bracket at the Canadian championships. Nevertheless, Wolf achieved a National Ranking of #11 in Vets behind Jensen.

NAVY TEAM— again used their depth and superior conditioning under new coach Bob Bayliss to be ranked in top five intercollegiately.

JIM HENSE— teamed with Scott Ryan, and Dave Page to help them win the 3 man "A" league title in Philadelphia. He also participated in the Gold Racquets and Holt Bulington Tournaments before his "back turned on him". This year he will be Chairman of the National Juniors for the third time in four years.

1979-80 should bring even more participation by Marylanders with the National Juniors planned at Penn., the National Singles at Princeton, and the national doubles at Wilminton. The singles sites will have play in Men's and Women's events on the same dates. Maryland's own Invitation Singles and Doubles will be sactioned by the USSRA in 1980 and should attract more stars from "the tour" as well as top local talent.

# THE U.S. NAVAL ACADEMY by Bob Bayliss

The Twenty-sixth Annual Class "A" Invitational five man team tournament was held at the Naval Field House on Thanksgiving weekend. A hungry team from Schuylkill Squash Club in Philadelphia went on to defeat the U.S. Naval Faculty four matches to one in the finals.

A total of \$625 in prize money was offered in addition to prizes and trophles. Funds were raised through the generous donations of several anonymous friends of squash and the prizes, trophies, and tee-shirts were donated by local businesses. As spectators literally hung from the rafters at the Downtown Racquet Club, Barbara Maltby once again breezed through the competition. Defeating Goldie Edwards in 3 straight games in the finals, Barbara continued to make it look easy! Ginny Akabane captured third place as she topped Lisa Drake in the third/fourth play-off competion. With a repeat performance, heartbreak hotel guest Connie Pierce managed to thrill the crowd in a well-played, come-from-behind, five-game defeat of Carol Weymuller to take the feed-in consolation title.

Ushered in by an all-day snow storm, the annual Maryland State Squash Championship Tournament was held the weekend of January 12-14. As expected Joyce Hogan, the #1 seed, coasted through the competition never loosing a game; however, such was not the case in the other rounds as unseeded Mary McGuirk upset the #3 and #2 seeds in her bid for the finals. In the third/fourth playoff competition, third place went to Nancy Taylor with her 3-0 defeat of Linda Denton.

Two doubles tournaments were held this year — one in October and the annual Maryland State Doubles Championships in March. Joyce Hogan and Denise Galambos victories in their bid against finalists Mary McGuirk and Linda Denton in the fall tournament and Joyce, teamed with Margaret Riehl, bested the team of Nancy Taylor and Helen lacy in the finals of the Maryland State Doubles Competition in March.

Washington hosted the fourth annual Stevens Cup in March and, for the first time in the history of the competition, took home the honors. Increased participation by Maryland women was promoted this year by several factors: an increased number of tournaments, the weekend format, and the better communication of the squash community both at the state and national levels. Maryland women are looking forward to an equally successful season in 1979-80.




