





What do Jack Miller, Jim Lacy, Jr., Sandy Martin, Jim Lacy, III, John MacCall and Skippy all have in common?

Each of them has won the Maryland State Doubles Championship with Joe Lacy.

Now some of the purists might question Skippy the chimpanzee who showed up at a surprise 40th birthday party for Joe, and who, while circulating among the guests on his roller skates, thoroughly enjoyed the buffet at the BCC—especially the fruit. Oh yes, he did carry a squash racquet with him at all times, even while shaking hands. I figure at that stage in Joe's career, he and Skippy could easily have won the State A's!

Seriously though, Joe Lacy really does have a spectacular record on the doubles court. At the end of the 1983-84 season and still going strong at 52 years old, Joe can count 14 State wins which is only one behind Bill Lamble's 15 and ahead of brother Jim's 10 and Sandy Martin's 8. There have been many exciting victories along the way since the first one in 1963, but I would guess that the win with his nephew Jim in 1976 just had to be very special and at least rank on a par with the seven championships with brother Jim.

Joe's father was a State doubles champ, so the Lacy family can claim doubles winners through three generations!

Statistics are cold and impersonal and cannot begin to convey the heart, the stamina, and the competitive spirit that went into all these

matches, but space precludes my going into too much detail. Combined with the previously mentioned State championships, the following doubles record is extremely impressive. Joe has 11 Maryland Club wins—the first one with me in 1966, and needless to say, I have not won since. Sandy Martin has 10. Joe won the State Veterans four times, the State Seniors once, and the Baltimore Senior Invitational once. The latter tournament just started last year and attracted teams from all over the U.S. and Canada. At the BCC, Joe won 8 Invitational Tournaments and 9 club championships. I have tried to pick events that have been played over a number of years and will probably continue to be played for some time to come. From 1963 through the '83-'84 season, Joe has compiled a total of 48 major wins. Not even considering the countless runner-up trophies, that sure is an

awful lot of silver (pewter!) to keep clean!

I personally feel that during this past season Joe accomplished the most unbelievable feat of all. For the first time in the history of Maryland squash, a player in the same year won the A, the Veteran, and the Senior State Doubles Championships. I sincerely doubt that anyone will ever equal this record—unless, of course, Joe does it again!

No article on Joe Lacy would be complete without citing his outstanding sportsmanship. You must know that over 21 years there had to be some "tough calls," but win or lose, Joe always came off the court with the admiration and respect of his partner, and the other team as well. A super record, a truly great doubles player, and a real credit to the game of squash. That is my friend Joe.


The USSRA Championships



Jim McCaslin (right) won the English Ball Tournament in a 3-2 match over Jim Tillman.





over John Bremermann and Scott Supplee, 3-0.




MSSRA SENIOR DOUBLES

It is hoped that both of these teams will be able to play in next year's Nationals and that we can have an all Baltimore finals!





For the fourth consecutive year, Sandy Martin has proven to be the best in Maryland. So it was, on the weekend of January 2, as 78 players competed for top honors.

At first it appeared that Martin had met his match in the young and aggressive Pat Miller. But, it took Miller until game three to gain any momentum. In the first two games, Martin played effortlessly. He controlled the T and moved the ball around at will. In game 3, Miller began to control the momentum with drop shots that kept Martin from hitting his effective 3-wall shots. But, Martin was never far behind. Down 10-13, Martin gained a 14-14 tie with the help of several unforced errors. Miller, faced with a no-set or set to 3, chose the latter. Miller won the first point, but as in

Rankings also held in the women's championship, with top seeds Nancy Cushman and Laurie Stieff paired in the finals. Having just returned to singles competition, Cushman started slowly and found herself behind 2-5 in the first game. As her shot selection improved and she controlled the T, she then out-scored Stieff 13-2 to win the opening game. The last two games followed a similar pattern. Cushman's drop shots and boasts kept Stieff constantly out of the play. In the last two games, Stieff could only once put together a rally of 4 points, as the game scores were 15-7, 7, 9.

A strong B player for the past few years, Dave Barclay had to overcome a very competitive Steve Kelly for the B championship. Both finalists entered the tournament unranked. Barclay defeated top seeded John Voneiff in the semifinals 3-2, and Kelly upset the fourth seeded Bill Bruchey by a similar score. In the first game, after opening an early 5-3 lead, Barclay made several unforced errors which Kelly took advantage of to win the first game 15-8. The next two games were close in the early going, but Barclay then opened up leads from which Kelly could not recover. The fourth game was very close, but Barclay took it and the match. 


