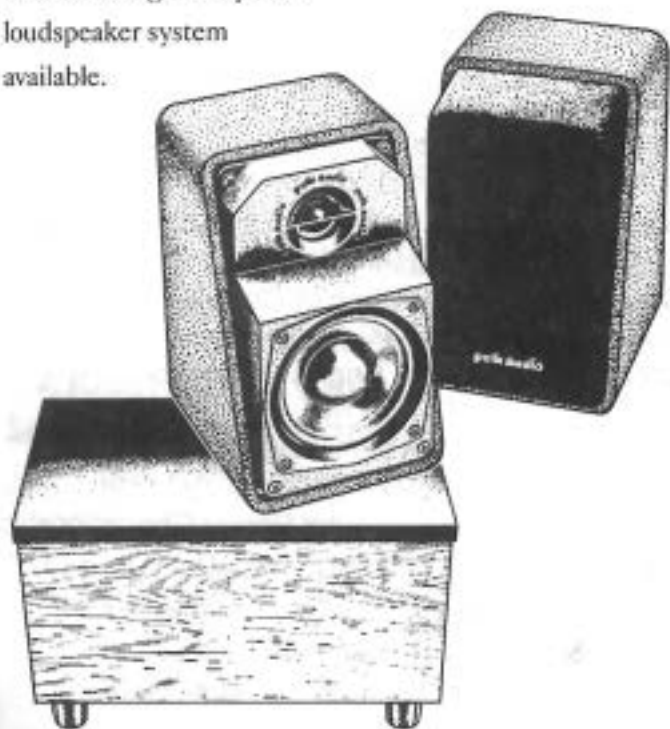

## BALTIMORE CITY OPEN (1989)

This year's Baltimore City Open, held on the weekend of November 17-19, offered the local squash community and excellent variety of native and out of town talent. The four men's flights were highlighted by the victory of D.C. based Ross Campbell over Dirck Bartlett in the Open Flight finals.

Campbell played the entire tournament with consistent determination, strong racquet skills and a precise short game. The younger Bartlett proved a worthy foe, relying on quickness and endurance, but he came up a bit short in the finals, losing 3-1 to Campbell.

The Men's B Flight was won by native Kevin Connor, who defeated Bob Vaeth in the final, also by a score of 3-1. The match was a see-saw battle between two quality players, and Connor's ability to mix up his shots provided him with a slight edge. The C Flight was dominated by teen sensation Alex Deitz, a high school squash player attending the Hill School. Deitz' excellent racquet skills outlasted Mark Lanning in the finals, 3-0.

The Men's D Flight was won by Jesse Polansky over Helen Marshall by a convincing 3-0 margin. The Women's A-B Flight was a round robin elimination, and Patrice Cromwell of Baltimore defeated Jesse Wittich, also a local, by the score of 3-0 in the final. Cromwell needed all the tricks of her repertoire to defeat Wittich, last year's finalist in the National Women's B Flight.

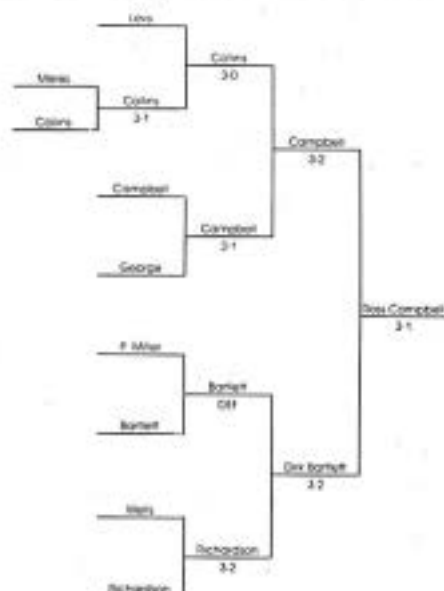

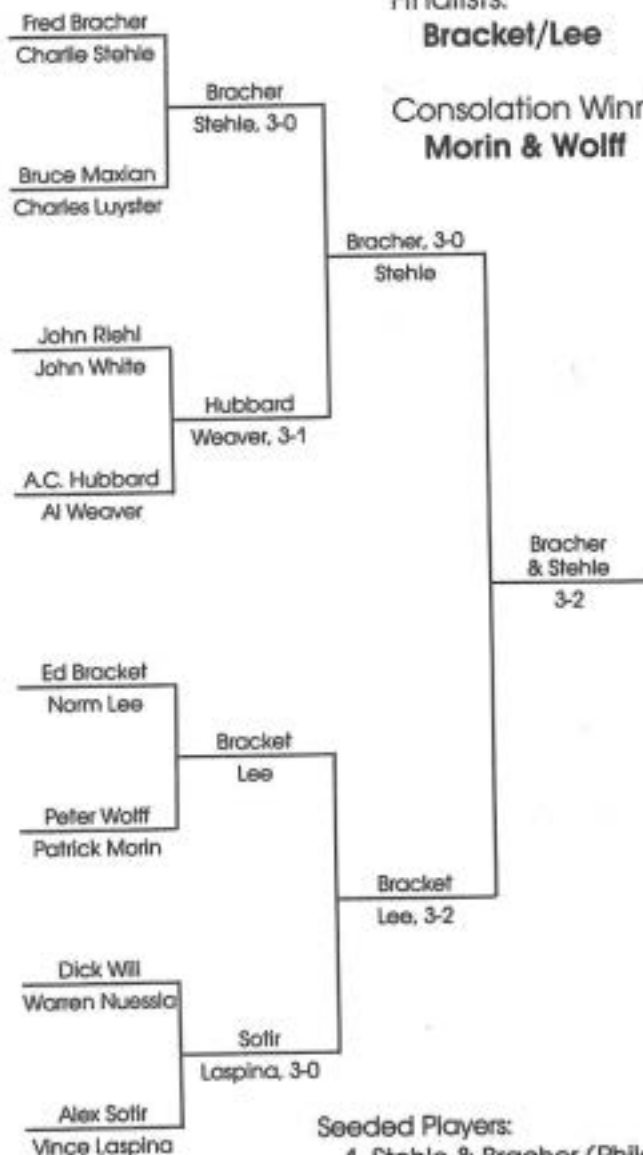

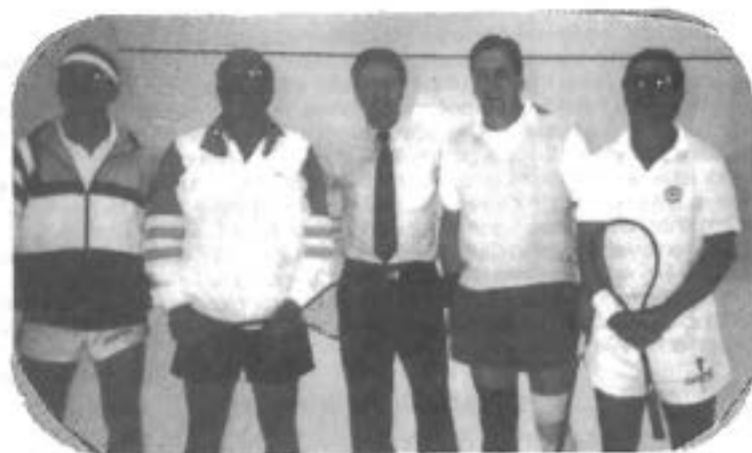

### THE FITZGERALD CUP (1990)

Forty-one years ago, William H. G. Fitzgerald, a prominent Washington businessperson and an avid squash and tennis player, established the Fitzgerald Cup. The purpose of the Fitzgerald Cup was to bring together 13-man teams from Baltimore and Washington to compete for the right to retain the Cup for a one-year period.

The warm fellowship has always been more important than winning, both during and following the matches. Each year, the hosting team holds a party, usually at the home of one of the players, or at Bill Fitzgerald's home in Washington. Although Baltimore trails in the series 26-14, Baltimore remains undefeated in enjoying the post-match party.

Several years ago, in an attempt to broaden the base of participation, age categories were established. Each team must now consist of at least one player age 60, 55, 50, 45, 40 and 35 or older with all the other players being any age. After a player has participated on the team five times, his name is engraved on the Cup. The names read like a who's who in Baltimore/Washington squash with only one player, Frank Gould, having his name recorded on both teams. No local players have ever played longer and been more active supporters of the Fitzgerald Cup than many-times state singles champion, Bill Lambie and Tommy Schweizer. The good sportsmanship and friendship that characterizes the Fitzgerald Cup are really what the game is all about.

All members of the Maryland State Squash Racquets Association were welcome and encouraged to attend both the matches and the party.
