



Finally, your Board Members are doing an excellent job working with the area clubs and professionals. If any problems, ideas or suggestions arise, please do not hesitate to call on them.


May all of you enjoy your finest squash season ever.







BALTIMORE CITY OPEN

Paul Assaiante, the number three seed, took top honors in the 14th Annual Baltimore City Open held on November 16-18, 1990. In the "A" finals, Paul, the Baltimore Country Club pro, ousted Jim Zug, the many time national doubles champion, before a packed audience at Maryland Club's new squash facility. The final went five games (15-11, 15-17, 17-18, 16-18, and 15-9). Jim kept himself in the match, with his short game, but in the end Paul's good gets and power game proved too much for the just-turned 50-year-old.

In the "A" consolation finals, Donnie Townsend handled improving Mike McShane (3-0).

In the semi-finals, Paul bumped defending champion Ross Campbell of Washington, D.C. in three, while Jim beat the number two seeded Nat Otis of Philadelphia in a thrilling five game. Jim defeated Penn coach Phil Decola in the quarters 3-0, while Paul handled Doug Rice, a top area doubles player, in four games.

The "B" flight featured a very strong performance by third seeded, local teenager, Alex Deitz (Hill School). Alex dropped only one game, the 2nd in the finals, to George Brush (15-11, 15-17, 15-13 and 15-14). Alex's variety of nicks, boasts, and Philadelphia shots proved too much as he rolled over the number one seed Brian McKenna (New York) in the semis, and Bob Vaeth in the quarters. Brush stopped Bob Carr in the semis (3-0), and Dave Senft in his quarters (3-0).

The "C" flight proved to be most competitive, with Joel Schoenblum, the number three seed, ousting Allen Tien in a tight four game final. Bruce Smith and Abayomi Onashile (Nigeria) fell victim to Schoenblum in the semis and quarters respectively. Tien bumped Paul Littman in the semis and Dwayne Gaithers (Richmond) in the quarters by 3-1 and 3-1 counts.

The "C" consolation final saw John Warmath squeak by Barry Rollins in a very contested five game.

The "D" draw pitted two best friends who play every week against each other. On this day, Jack Simanski proved to be the better player by a 3-1 score over Porter Siems. Simanski edged out McGill James in the semis while Siems battered Hans Wittich.

The Novice group final saw Bill Shepard defeat Dave Dupree by a 3-1 count. Bill topped David Seiler in the semi, and Dave got by young Robby Patton in his half. Robby earlier knocked out Trey Fitzpatrick, son of the famous shot-maker, Joe Fitzpatrick.

Mary Alice's brother, Mark, flew in from Texas to witness her win but to no avail.



Open ranked racquetball player, has adjusted to the longer racquet and smaller ball quite well. His hard drives and cross courts, along with Rice's reverses, proved to be too much for Pat and Paul to handle. The five game final was viewed by a full house at the Baltimore Country Club. The Miller-Rice duo ousted in three Sandy Martin and Dave Warfield in the semis, while Paul and Pat did the same to the veteran team of John Voneiff and Jim Zug.

The B Flight was won by a couple of guys from Annapolis, Dave Barclay and Bruce Rankin. They topped Bill Peck and Jim Smith in three and proved you don't need a doubles court to practice on to win.

The C Flight proved to be the most competitive division. When the final point was won, Randy Brinton and Gerrit Vreeland came out victorious. In the final, they defeated fellow Maryland clubbers Ken Yellot and Chuck Rogers in a thrilling, long five game match. Vreeland was supposed to play with Jeff Amling, but Amling was unable to play the 1st match, so Randy Brinton filled in. Little did Randy know that he and Gerrit would win and then oust #1 seed Bill Feiss and Harry McDonough, 3-0.

Yellot and Rogers bumped off an ever improving Rob Krizek (of Towson State fame) and his partner Bob Edgington (a world class fencer) in the same by a 3-0 tally. Bob only saw 80% of the play on his forehand side.


rails. In the end, Mary Alice's deep ones overcame Patti's short winners. It was a fun-filled match enjoyed by all.

The 73rd Maryland State Squash Singles Championships were held over the first two weekends in February 1991. Over 110 players competed in the various divisions. The M.S.S.R.A. Doubles Championships were the last two weekends in March with singles teams in competition.

Singles top honors went to Patrick Miller who edged Dirck Bartlett in a hard fought, five game thriller at the Maryland Club. The last two games ended in overtime. Pat was a finalist in last year's championship match. Bartlett could have won by default due to illness but elected to play. In the Semi-Finals Bartlett, the fourth seed, ousted the defending champion, Sandy Martin, coming back to win with three match points in the fifth game. The ever improving Alex Dietz made a good showing in a losing effort to Sandy Martin. The "A" consos was captured by Don Townsend, Jr. over fellow Racquet Clubber, Mark Lanning.

The "B" Flight turned up the most upsets, with three falling in the round of sixteen. Henry Thomas topped Bob Vaeth in three, to win this division. In their semis, Thomas won in three over Jim Martin, while Vaeth went the distance with number one seed, Kevin Connor. The "B" Consolation honors went to Allan Acton over M.S.S.R.A. treasure Ken Katz.

In the "C" Flight, #1 seed Allen Tien lost only one game on his path to victory, and that to the ever improving Rob Krizek, a former tennis star, now under the tutorage of Paul Assaiante at the Baltimore Country Club. To reach the finals, Allen erased Patrice Cromwells's (Alicia McConnell's sister) hopes of a crown, while Rob beat out John Depman. John Simanski won the "C" Consolations over his good friend Porter Siems, in a five gamer.

Unseeded, Chris Matthai took top honors in the "D" Flight. In the finals, he fought his way to a 3-1 win over Barry Rollins. M.S.S.R.A. RANKINGS - 1990-1991

Based on our 90-91 season, we revised the ranking system in all singles and doubles divisions. A numerical system was used based: on the Baltimore City Open and State Championships for singles; and, the Fall Doubles, Baltimore Invitational Doubles, Baltimore Seniors and Masters Doubles and the State Doubles Championships. The Committee consisted of Paul Assaiante, Nancy Cushman, Frank Cushman, Jim Taylor, and Bob Everd. Players may appeal to the Ranking Committee. M.S.S.R.A. rankings were last published in our 88-89 yearbook. All #1 and #2 singles and #1 ranked doubles players must compete in the next higher division in 1991-1992.

Singles Handball rankings are placed next to the name of each member listed in the M.S.S.R.A. Roster. These are used as a guide to tournament participation. Women are ranked by their standing in the Women's Divisions. The M.S.S.R.A. recognizes that players may compete at different levels in Doubles and Soft Ball. Next year we hope to have rankings in each category.

RANKING SYSTEM

In a typical round of sixteen - 1 point for entering. Plus 1 point for first round winners. Plus 2 points for quarterfinalists. Plus 3 points for semifinalists. Plus 4 points for the champion. Thus, the winner has a total of 11 points, semi finalists 7 points, etc... A double value is awarded for the State Champion. In case of ties, head-to-head competition is the deciding factor; otherwise the players are shown as tied.
