BALTIMORE CITY OPEN

The 1991 Baltimore City Open was a "tournament for all" with a record number of participants. Flights for men and women in hard ball (37 entries) and soft ball (86 entries) were offered.

HARD BALL RESULTS

The men's A flight was a Washington, D.C. final. Nathaniel Otis defeated fellow Capital Hill player, Rob Adams in five games. The women combined for a B/C flight, where club rivals Lizz Everts and Joan Weyers did battle. Everts held on to take the title.

SOFT BALL RESULTS

David Levy of Washington, D.C. was the men's A flight champion. He ousted Don Townsend, Jr. in three. Don had his glory day on Saturday, when he beat Hunt Richardson in four games. Levy had beaten a newcomer to Baltimore—Chris O'Donnell. The A consolation winner was Andy Hubbard over Riaz Arshad.

The men's B flight was a Baltimore final. Sam Sisodia took out Mark Lanning in 3 games. In the semis, Lanning defeated long time rival, Bob Vaeth in 4 games. Sisodia beat Pittsburgh's, Todd Knutson in 3. David Teulon of Penn State defeated Bob Everd of Baltimore in the consolation final.

Wendell McConnie of Penn State captured the men's C title. He beat Baltimorean, Bob Edgington in 3 games. Edgington had defeated Chris Brown in the semis, while McConnie ousted John Mosmiller. Brian Swanson was the victor over John Brush in the consolations.

The D flight saw Randal Etheridge, one of the top area junior players, reach the semi-final round. Randal could not get by Marty Popp, where he lost in 4. In the other half, Jim Burch eliminated Bill White and went on to become the D Champion by defeating Popp in 3. Robin Goldman beat Mark Roden in 3 in the D consos and John Johnson defeated Doug Lombardo in the C/D consos.

In the Veteran's flight, Washington's Ed Reiner hung on to defeat Baltimore's Geof Goodson in a tough five game. In the semis John Minkowski fell to Reiner and Denis Bourke fought hard, but succumbed to Goodson in five.

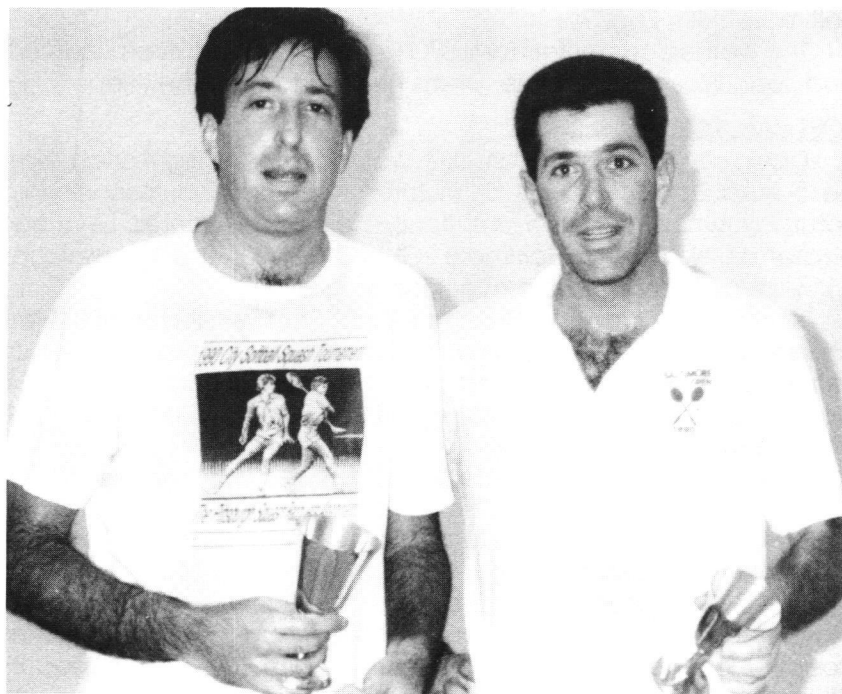
Gerd Petrich of Baltimore became the fifties champ by defeating Barton Browning of Penn State in five games.

CHAMPIONS

The 14th Annual Fall Doubles Tournament, with 40 participating teams, was held during the week of December 2-6, 1991. This tournament not only attracted record numbers of players, but also provided players and spectators alike with very entertaining and exciting matches.

Forty teams battled for the crown in four different flights: The depth of each draw was evidenced by the fact that no team dominated its bracket. In the Men's A flight, the surprise team of Bob Travers and Paul Assaiante upset the defending champions, Doug Rice and Ira Miller, 3-1 in the semifinals had squeezed out a tough three game victory in the final over multi-state champions Sandy Martin and Dave Warfield. What made this win most remarkable was that Travers was not completely recovered from a life-threatening case of hepatitis which he had contracted while biking around the world. Of special note was the father-son team of Jim Zug Junior and Senior who played marvelously in both the quarterfinals and semifinals where they succumbed in a tough five game to Warfield/Martin.

The unseeded team of Bob Everd and Neil Sandson knocked off both the first and second seeds to snatch the Men's B crown. Top seeded Bruce Rankin and Dave Barclay from Annapolis went down in four tight games in the semifinals and second seeded Don Townsend, Sr. and Brian Effinger lost in three straight in the final. Of special note was the fact that three women played very well in this flight, with Nancy Cushman, Karen Rosenberg and Kathy Connor receiving well

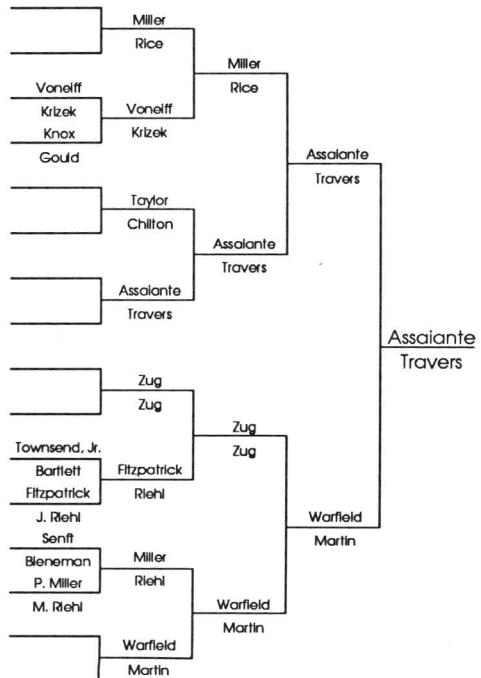
deserved kudos for their efforts.

In the Men's C flight, the No. 1 seeds, Haswell Franklin and Blaz Jurko, lost only one game and that in a very entertaining final to Dave deVilliers and Joe Harlan. Harlan and deVilliers are big men who camp out in front of the red line and create all kinds of confusion. They upset No. 2 seeds Mike Jemann and Bob Leitch in the semifinals while Franklin and Jurko beat Paul Knott and Harry McDonough 3-0 in the other semifinal.

The Women's draw was divided into round robin pools with the winners in each flight then playing for top honors. Joan Weyers and Liz Everts finished first in one flight followed by Alice Collins and Lisa Roy second and Louise Meledin and Ellen Durrett third. In the second flight, Christina Lundquist and Mary Alice Gentry placed first with Julie Miller and Patty Minkowski second and Dyson Stockman and Lea Kusner third. In the final, Weyers/Everts stole a tough three gamer from Lundquist/Gentry, 15-11, 15-11, 15-13.

Baltimore is a perfect site for an event of this size because it boasts four fine doubles courts. Frank and Nancy Cushman of the Racquet Club of Roland Park and Jim Taylor of the Maryland Club provided assistance which helped ensure the event's success.

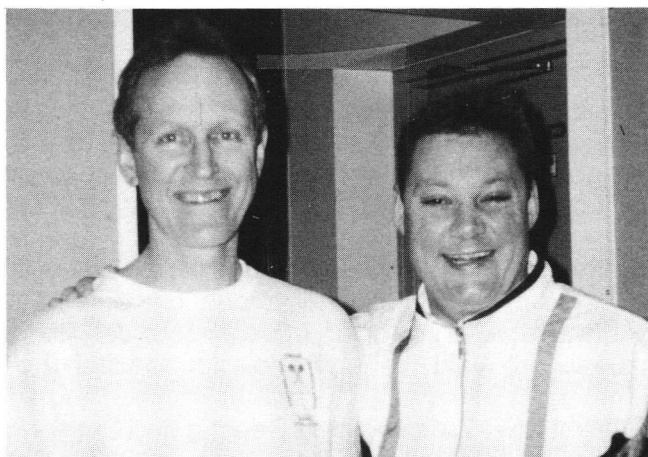

Jim Taylor, Tournament Director and head professional at the host Maryland Club, did an outstanding job with sponsors, favors, and the

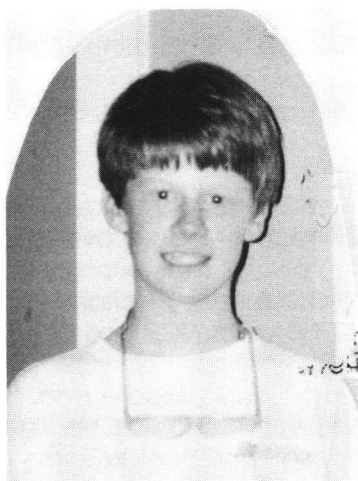

Who are Connie Bienfait, Kiki Bassel, Rita Doucas, Dana Wood, Dana McLellan, Barbara Nuessle? Do you know Gerrie Tisdall, Eileen McPhail, Penny Hubbard, Connie Maxian, Marge Riehl? Do the names Sue McLain, Eleanor Weaver, Pat Layden, Joanne Stehle, Norma Sotir, Margot Shriver, Meg Roe, Gladys Pilsworth, Liz Heisler, Anita Easterbrook, Doris Hicks and Anna Everd mean anything to you?

These are the ladies who showcased their controlled demeanor, their quick reflexes, their agility and lightness of foot during the first weekend of February 1992. Not by doing battle with one another. No! '92 MARYLAND SOFT BALL

After a 2-year lapse, Raheil Qureshi (teaching pro at Worldgate, VA) regained the "A" flight Champion title. A numerical point system is used to establish position. Every entrant receives 1 point for entering the tournament. Each round of the tournament is assigned a point value. One point for the first round, two points for the second, three for the third, four the fourth, etc. As a player reaches every round, the points for that round are added to the points earned in the previous round.

In a typical round of sixteen – 1 point for entering, plus one point for first round winners (quarter-finalists), plus 2 points for second round winners (semi-finalists), plus 3 points for third round winners (finalists), plus 4 points for the champion. Thus, the winner has a total of 11 points, finalists 7 points, etc. A double value is awarded for the State Championships. In the event of a tie numerically, head to head competition is the deciding factor, otherwise the players are shown as tied. Any opints earned in a combined flight (example C/D) are added to that players total point score in any C or D flight entered in other tournaments.

Tournaments whose results count toward ranking are the Baltimore City Open, Fall Doubles, all State Championships, The Seniors/Masters and The Baltimore Invitational Doubles.

All single players ranked #1 and #2 must compete in the next higher class in the 1992-93 season. The #1 ranked doubles team must compete in the next higher class in the 1992-93 season.

Each player is classified in the ROSTER for Hard Ball (HB), Soft Ball (SB), Doubles (D), Unclassified (U), Retired (R). Women are listed in the Women's Class. Players may request a change in class by contacting Bob Everd. Those not unclassified should do the same.
