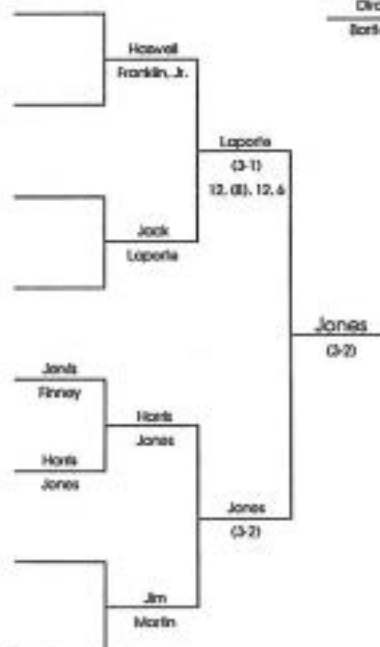
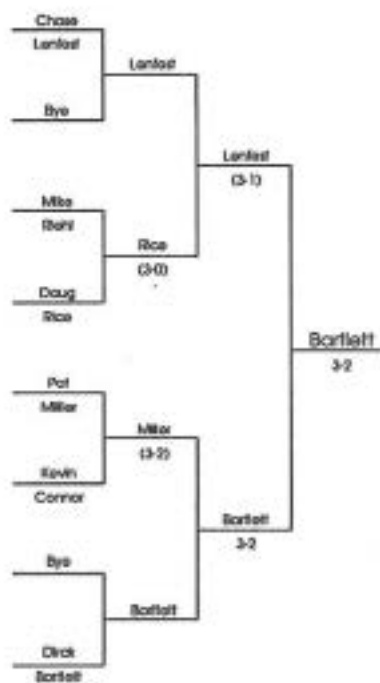
The Vets finals, yet to be concluded, pits two outstanding players, Jim Zug and Sandy Martin going for this title.

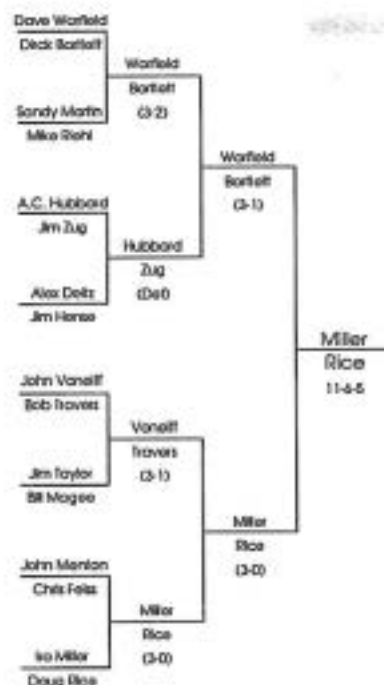
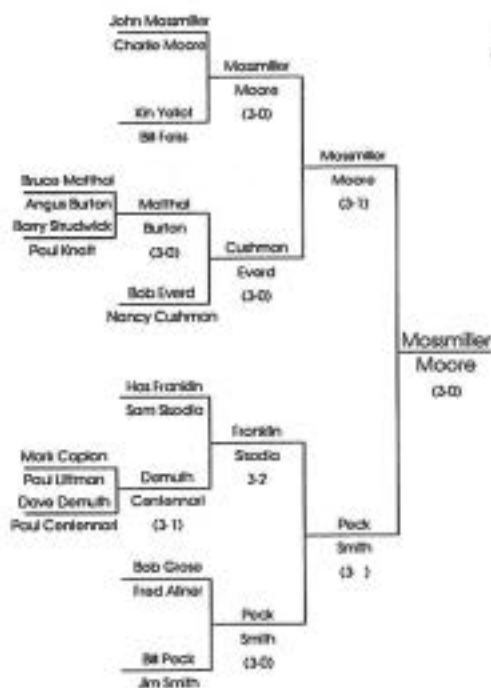
The Ladies "B" round went to Louise Meleding and Dyson Stockman in another five game, edging Patti Minkowski and Ann Demuth.

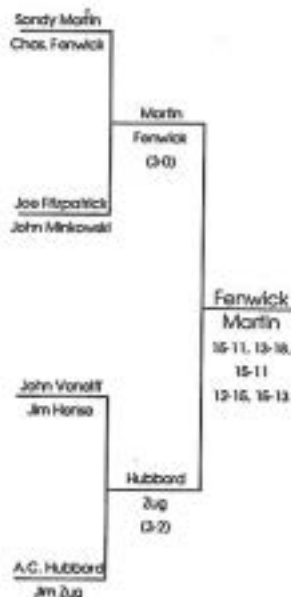

Prix. With a purse of \$5,000, the tournament attracted 30 international squash pros from countries as diverse as Australia, Argentina, England, Pakistan and Guyana.

The week got under way with the pro draw Qualifier where 16 players competed for four places in the main draw. Baltimore locals Donnie Townsend and Paul Assalante were granted automatic entry in the Qualifier and each relished the opportunity to test their squash skills against a world-class pro. Both put up gallant efforts but were defeated 3-0.

The Pro final went according to seedings. Number one seed Anders Wahlstedt, a Swedish pro based in New York, beat the number two seed Canadian Sabir Butt in the final 3-1 (15/10, 13/15, 17/16, 15/7). Interestingly, the pros play using the American scoring system where every rally wins a point and each game is played to 15 points.

In addition to the pro event, over 90 amateurs competed in eight flights. Australians Matt Crawcour and Scott Chamings, both losers in the pro Qualifier, played against our locals in the Men's A flight and they met each other in the final. Without the pressure of world ranking points at stake, Crawcour and Chamings let loose with a vast array of shots and some entertaining and, at times, humorous squash. The match went to Crawcour 3-2. Crawcour beat Paul Assalante 3-0 in one semifinal and Chamings beat another Scott—Scott Gwozdz from Washington—3-0 in the other semifinal.

However, Franklin had expended too much. Fried quickly pounced on the opportunity when he sensed his opponent weakening and closed out the fifth game 9-2.

MSSRA RANKINGS 1992-93

RANKING COMMITTEE – Paul Assaiante, Nancy and Frank Cushman, Jim Taylor and Bob Everd.

A numerical point system is used to establish position. Every entrant receives 1 point for entering the tournament. Each round of the tournament is assigned a point value. One point for the first round, two points for the second, three for the third, four the fourth, etc. As a player reaches every round, the points for that round are added to the points earned in the previous round.

In a typical round of sixteen – 1 point for entering, plus one point for first round winners (quarter-finalists), plus 2 points for second round winners (semi-finalists), plus 3 points for third round winners (finalists), plus 4 points for the champion. Thus, the winner has a total of 11 points, finalists 7 points, etc. A double value is awarded for the State Championships. In the event of a tie numerically, head to head competition is the deciding factor, otherwise the players are shown as tied. Any points earned in a combined flight (example C/D) are added to that player's total point score in any C or D flight entered in other tournaments.

Tournaments whose results count toward ranking are the Baltimore City Open, Fall Doubles, State Championships, The Seniors/Masters and The Baltimore Invitational Doubles.

All single players ranked #1 and #2 must compete in the next higher class in the 1992-93 season. The #1 ranked doubles team must compete in the next higher class in the 1992-93 season.

Each player is classified in the ROSTER for Hard Ball (HB), Soft Ball (SB), Doubles (D), Unclassified (U), Retired (R). Women are listed in the Women's Class. Players may request a change in class by contacting Bob Everd. Those not unclassified should do the same.
